Group Projects: Evaluations

You will write an assessment of your group as part of your grade. This details what you should include:

Original Responsibilities

- Who was supposed to do what

Final Responsibilities

- How things changed
- Who actually did what

Assessment of Group Members

- Grade (A-F)
- Explanation of why you graded them this way
- BE AS DETAILED AS POSSIBLE

From the group project description:

Each member of the group will "grade" the other members according to their effort in the project in a written assessment. This assessment will include a "grade" as well as an explanation of who did what. Be as detailed as possible. Whatever collective grade the display and presentation receive for the group, each member will get a grade equal to their percentage of involvement.

For example, your group's display earns a 40 and presentation earns a 45. Your group members give you a "C+" on your percentage effort towards the group effort (78%). You write a proper assessment of how your group worked together (10 points). Your grade: $10 + (40 \text{ points} + 45 \text{ points}) \times 75$ % = $10 + (85) \times 0.78 = 76.3\% = C$. Note that group participation is very important to your grade; to do well you must be actively involved. This also means you cannot just jump ahead and do everything without input from your group. You must work **together**.
